

BROADWAY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

Scholarships are awarded in recognition of outstanding youth who are regular attenders/members of Broadway United Methodist Church. All High School graduates and GED recipients are eligible to apply to the scholarship committee for awards from the various scholarships available.

STANDARDS OF ELIGIBILITY

ALL APPLICANTS FOR SCHOLARSHIPS MUST BE:

- A member/participant of Broadway United Methodist church
- Actively involved in church and community activities (i.e. regular attendance in Worship, Sunday School, UMYF, choir, service projects), and demonstrate leadership.
- Scholastically competent by maintaining a 2.75 GPA (4.0 scale)
- Attending accredited schools, enrolled with a minimum of 12 hours per semester
- Special consideration is given to applicants entering church-related occupations.

ALL APPLICANTS FOR GRANTS MUST BE:

- G.P.A. 2.0 or better
- Complete high school with diploma or GED
- Minimum of 12 hours/semester (college credit)
- Prefer member of BUMC but will consider non-members
- Have set goals and plans to improve my current situation and pursue my dreams.
- Could be high school seniors applying, but may be young people in the workforce or people who dropped out of school (after completing high school) and know they need to expand their knowledge and education
- Structured in your life shown through involvement with church and community service
- May reapply a second year for this grant

Scholarship and grant checks will be available from the church office on or about August 1.

AVAILABLE SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS INCLUDE:

Broadway, Maynard & Emma Ridlen or Doris Toland scholarships for a maximum of four years provided funding is available. Recipients must demonstrate an ongoing relationship with both Broadway and a church in the community where they attend college (i.e. regular worship attendance, Wesley Foundation participation, ongoing Bible study groups, and worship attendance at Broadway when home).

Donald & Evelyn McMullen, Beth Petersen, Bill Samuelson, Kris Lippke, United Methodist Women, and Douglas Vergamini Memorial Scholarships are one time gifts.

Dorothy Mae Boone and Harold & Everall Pengra Seminary Scholarships are for those persons from Broadway attending a United Methodist Seminary. If there are no Broadway seminary students the Boone Scholarship fund shall be divided among the United Methodist students from Southwest Iowa attending Saint Paul School of Theology in Kansas City. If there is no one from Southwest Iowa the funds will be sent to the Saint Paul School of Theology General Scholarship Fund.

Dean and Mona Daniels Memorial Scholarship is for Broadway elementary and older students including adults wishing to develop their musical ability from a private tutor to play a musical instrument, (i.e.) piano, organ, etc. which will enhance the music program at Broadway United Methodist Church. A brief statement of plans, signed by student and music coordinator or senior pastor of the church is needed for consideration. A letter of intent for continuation of a scholarship for another year must be sent

to the church office by designated date each year with an instructor's note on attendance and competency/improvement. Responsibility for awarding this scholarship is with the Fine Arts Ministry Team.

The Thomas and Donna Walker Grant

A grant has been created by Thomas and Donna Walker. Tom and Donna have enjoyed helping youth throughout their lives. They believe, with a little encouragement, these young people will be able to "step-up" to the next chapter in their lives. This grant is to be used as a motivator for young adults to improve their lives through more schooling beyond high school. Those applying for this grant must believe in themselves, understanding that they have the potential to achieve their goals - both personal and academic.

Incomplete and/or late applications will not be considered for a scholarship.
